UNDERGRADUATE COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Freddie D. Coleman

ESPN Radio Host

Freddie D. Coleman is a nationally syndicated radio host on ESPN Radio, who joined the 24-hour entertainment and sports network in June 2004. He is the co-host of the afternoon drive show, Freddie and Harry from 3-7pm ET alongside former NFL player Harry Douglas. Prior to that, he co-hosted the Freddie and Fitzsimmons Show weeknights as well as the Freddie Coleman Show and GameNight.

Mr. Coleman makes appearances on ESPN's First Take and does voice-overs for other ESPN shows. He has also covered the NFL Draft live from Radio City Music Hall. Throughout his 20 years at ESPN, Freddie has had the pleasure of interviewing athletes and entertainers such as Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, coaching legend Nick Saban, Daniel Radcliffe, Hugh Jackman, NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell, Charles Barkley, and Venus Williams.

Coleman is a 1987 graduate of Mansfield University in Mansfield, Pennsylvania and earned a BA in Mass Communication with a minor in Journalism. He was a standout football player for the Mountaineers and became the 2nd Mountaineer wide receiver to earn All-PSAC honors in 1986 as well as being named a Top 40 Receiver nationally.

Not just focused on football, Coleman took advantage of his college days at Mansfield and worked his way to Sports Editor for the campus newspaper, "The Flashlight" and was also a member of the campus radio station WNTE. He was also inducted into Mansfield University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2017.

Coleman's dedication to his craft has led him to many opportunities from 1988-2004. Prior to joining ESPN, he was the weekday afternoon co-host of

FOX Sports Radio's afternoon drive Tobin & Coleman Show on 980-AM in Albany, NY. He has also served as Program Director for Oldies 97, Poughkeepsie, NY and as an On-Air Personality for FM-103/Thunder 107, Portland, Maine, K-104 and 101.5/WPDH, Poughkeepsie, NY, and WWRL/1600-AM, NYC. He served as the Color Analyst for Army Basketball and Hockey at West Point as well as Color Analyst for Marist College Basketball in Poughkeepsie, NY. He was also an On-Air Sportscaster of Media-One's TV show SportScene in Wappingers Falls, N.Y.

Coleman has made numerous speaking engagements including at his alma mater as well high schools, colleges, charities and community events throughout his career. He has taught at Marist College as an adjunct professor. He is also the Color Analyst for Sacred Heart University's home football and men and women's basketball games.

Coleman is a member of the Football and Basketball Writers Association of America and the National Association of Black Journalists. He is a native of Brooklyn, New York and now resides in Connecticut with his wife, Denise. He also has a daughter named Briana.

THE UNIVERSITY

Mansfield University dates to 1857 when the Mansfield Classical Seminary opened with 105 students. In 1862, the institution was designated a State Normal School for the training of teachers.

Enrollment had grown to 400 by 1905. In 1927, Mansfield became the first school in Pennsylvania to be designated a State Teachers College, authorized by the State Board of Education to grant bachelor of science degrees in elementary and secondary education, music, and home economics.

In 1960, the school became Mansfield State College, a multi-purpose institution offering a broad range of curricula. On July 1, 1983, Mansfield University became a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education. In an effort to expand high-quality, affordable academic opportunities to support the needs of all learners,

Mansfield integrated with Bloomsburg and Lock Haven universities to form Commonwealth University of Pennsylvania in 2022.
