At Commonwealth University, we believe in creating opportunities that shape the future of our students. The Early College Program, our flagship early admissions initiative, offers students an exceptional college-level experience, fostering a smooth transition to full-time matriculated status and paving the way for their academic and professional success. By providing high school students with early access to college coursework, paired with comprehensive engagement, advisement, and support, the Early College Program creates a pathway for students to thrive at any Commonwealth University location as they work toward their post-secondary goals.

### WHY SUPPORT THE EARLY COLLEGE PROGRAM AT CU?

While the *Early College Program* opens doors to countless opportunities for ambitious high school students, it comes with financial barriers that not all families can overcome. The current tuition of \$115 per credit hour (\$345 for a 3-credit course) represents a fraction of traditional college costs, yet for many students from low- and middle-income families, this reduced rate is still a burden. Additionally, Early College students are not eligible for federal or state financial aid. Educational Income Tax Credit (EITC) funding is available, but covers less than 15% of students. That's why philanthropic support is essential to make this important program accessible to all students, regardless of their financial situation.
