2. In the Communication/Culture/Connections Category, minimum three groups must be selected. At least 6 credits must be from the Professional Communication Group.
3. In Language Communication Foundations Category, SPAN346 can be replaced with SPAN347 Spanish to English Translation and Interpretation
4. For Option 1 (Comparisons and Communities Requirement Category), courses taught in English are not eligible.
5. In the Communication/Culture/Connections Category, courses marked with an ampersand (&) may be counted only if an appropriate topic is offered.

Degree Requirements

All students must obtain a minimum of 120 credits and must take a minimum of 42 credits of advanced coursework. Advanced coursework can be met in major courses, minor courses, free elective courses, and general education courses. Courses that meet this requirement are designated in Banner. They must also complete all General Education requirements, and all requirements for the selected major. Meet with your advisor and consult Degree Works to monitor your progress and for all graduation requirements.

A minimum GPA of 2.0 in the major and overall are required.
