Bloomsburg Residential Parking Permits

Residential Permit sales have begun. Permits are valid from Sept. 1 to August 31 of each year. Traditionally the parking enforcement of the residential permitted areas ceases for the two weeks that the BU students move back in. This year, that time frame will be Aug. 15 to 26. If a permit is not displayed after that time frame the vehicle will be ticketed. Ticketing for failing to display the (new) 2022-2023 permits will begin Sept. 1. Ticketing for street maintenance will continue with no exceptions. There will be no grace period this year.

Park Vehicles Front-In on Campus

BU Police have adopted License Plate Recognition Technology (LPR) that uses cameras and optical character recognition (OCR) to translate vehicle plate images into a textual representation of the data. The technology allows BU police to scan up to 1,400 license plates a minute, making the department more efficient. Vehicle license plates serve as the permit to park in faculty/staff/student lots. Because the vehicle license plate serves as the "hang tag," the campus community must park in spaces front-in, rather than pulling through or backing into the space. Front end parking allows BU officers to be more efficient by the use of electronic license plate readers.
